love's on our minds a lot of the time. But frequently what seemed like the fulfillment of our dreams turns out to be a big yawn, or a nightmare. Humans naturally long for intimacy. Because we don't know enough about our own inner lives, we often sabotage our relationships with unrealistic expectations and unconscious projections. If we want to build a rewarding relationship with someone else, we have to start by exploring ourselves.

Using contemplative techniques and a variety of interpersonal exercises, participants in this weekend will examine preconceptions about love, explore how we communicate our attitudes verbally and otherwise, and create new scenarios for enlivening our love lives. The program will offer opportunities for couples to deepen their connections and for those not presently in a relationship to learn how to listen for love's knock.
